#### Science week

We have been holding our Science Week this week and the children have really enjoyed it! Following on from our visit to Dynamic Earth and the questions we had about taking care of our world (especially after International Polar Bear Day), our theme for the week has been conservation. Our younger children began the week with finding out about litter pollution and how we can prevent this. This included a 'litter walk' at home. Then through studying rainforests, the children found out how some rainforests are being destroyed and the effect this can have on our earth. Then, through lessons about our ocean environments, the children discovered how plastic and other waste can be dangerous to all living things.

Our older children have researched how different parts of the world have seasons and found out that in some parts of the world there are only two or three seasons! Then through work on water pollution, the children were horrified to learn about how this can affect us as humans along with other living organisms. They then focused on ways that humans can have a positive impact on nature. This will be brought to life next week when we do our beach clean on Holy Island. On Friday we were VERY excited as we took part in a live, interactive lesson with our science providers at Developing Experts. We found out how insects have a positive impact on our environments and how important they are to our world.

We will be taking part in the Big Plastic Count next week to continue our conservation and eco awareness theme. We would be very grateful if you could help your child use the tally chart to track how much plastic they throw away over a week. We will also count in school. This is not about blame, shame or rating anyone's recycling habits, and we wouldn't want anyone to feel embarrassed by how much plastic they use. We also know that there are some plastic items which are essential for disabled people, or people with medical conditions, and so these won't be included in the count.

#### **Dates for your Diary**
